

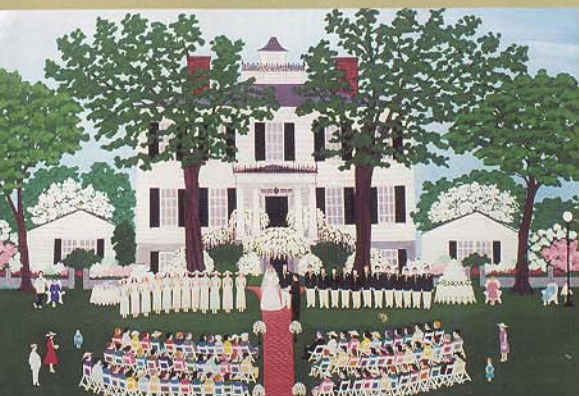

# OATLANDS PLANTATION

Oatlands, a national historic landmark, is a co-stewardship property of the National Trust, in partnership with a local non-profit organization.



First built in 1804 as a Federal style mansion by George

Carter, later remodeled in the fashionable Greek Revival style, it served for six decades of the 20th century as the country estate of Mr. & Mrs. William Corcoran Eustis.



In addition to the show, tour the mansion, meander through four acres of walled ornamental gardens, visit America's second oldest propagation greenhouse and wander over the rolling landscape to see barns and dependencies.
